Comfort in a Box

Navian Hawaii's pediatric team created bereavement boxes and sibling comfort kits to help families grieving the loss of a child and sibling. The boxes are priceless keepsakes and include the child's handprint and footprint as well as a precious lock of their hair. The sibling box provides materials for art and play to give children a safe outlet to express their feelings. The loss of a child is unimaginable but having the support of others during this difficult journey can make a big difference in a family's experience.



Pediatric Hospice

Hospice care isn't just for the elderly. It is for anyone facing a life-limiting illness, including children. Navian Hawaii's Manaolana Keiki was the very first pediatric hospice program in the state addressing the specific needs of terminally ill children and their families. The program provides the highest level of comfort and care based on the unique needs and age of each child.

Integrated Care

To assist individuals at every stage in life's journey, Navian Hawaii offers specialized medical and emotional support for patients living with serious, but treatable illness. Seriously ill patients who live alone and have limited resources and caregiver support may find it difficult to navigate Hawaii's complex

healthcare system. Our Integrated Care program alleviates the challenges and helps end the vicious cycle of unmet care needs that often leads to hospitalization. Our dedicated team provides disease process education, emotional support, advanced care planning and more.

Kailua Hospice Home

Our Kailua Hospice Home provides a home-away-from-home for patients who may need the extra support. Sometime, it's because they are no longer able to receive care at their own home. Other times, it's so they can give their caregiver a much-needed break. Regardless of the situation, the home is designed to provide comfort and care with its beautifully appointed living areas, landscaped yard and around-the-clock nursing care. In 2022, Navian Hawaii completed the purchase of the Kailua Hospice Home and has future plans to modernize and renovate the property.


We helped families and individuals in the community deal with grief and the loss of their loved ones.
